EVERYTHING: NOTHING [inCommon]

For **C A S S T L** linn press | specialists in contemporary art (Princeton) conceived a two-person exhibition titled **Everything : Nothing [in Common**].

With this exhibition linn press paired the creative compulsions of Oliver Bringer (La Garenne-Colombes, 1951) and David Moreno (Los Angeles, 1957.) The artists have never met, not even through technology. They do not communicate. They do not speak a common language.

Both artists create "energy works" that are added to individual, seemingly inexhaustible portfolios of music, visual art, and poetry. They share an urgent, individual necessity to make art. For this exhibition they both selected mainly drawings.

Bringer's aesthetic universe is intuitive, radical, and stunning. Moreno's universe is near monastic, in which he deliberately illustrates his inner life in the moment. The fact that Bringer and Moreno have everything and nothing in common makes for a simultaneous attraction and repulsion that defies categorization.
